What is your waste management plan?	Dogs have been trained not to defecate inside. They will be given breaks and walked outside by staff and any feces will be picked up by the handler with a 'doggy poo bag' and disposed of in an outside bin.

### PLEASE NOTE

- No animals or pets, with the exception of service dogs, are permitted in venue without prior approval.
- All animals permitted in the licensed area must be on a leash or in an enclosed pen, under the control of a handler at all times and must comply with all the requirements prescribed by law for the exhibition of such animals and in compliance with the *Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1986*.
- Animal waste must be disposed of appropriately.
- Animals must be removed from the venue overnight.
